
Ashley Sadlon, Juliette Fowler Communities

JLD Members are encouraged to take advantage of these programs and support the JLD with these alternate sources of funds.

Any members registering after March 17 will be assessed a \$25 late placement fee and will be placed starting in June.

Dues Increase and Payment Plan

Thanks to the support of our members, the dues increase passed and is in effect beginning with the 2019-2020 League year. Your dues pay for all of our fabulous volunteer training and for expenses associated with our invaluable headquarters staff and facility, allowing our members to be a strong force for good in our community.

We have heard you and your concerns, so new for the 2019-2020 League year we will be introducing payment plan options for members. JLD members can opt to pay their dues in three installments on the last day of January, February and March.

Women L.E.A.D. Competition is March 28

Women L.E.A.D. is thrilled to announce that they had approximately 160 initial prospective participants attend their workshops in October 2018 which were held at the three participating Dallas ISD





schools: Emmett J. Conrad High School, South Oak Cliff High School and Thomas Jefferson High School. The application deadline was Friday, Dec. 7, 2018. The applications will be scored and 10 finalists will be selected in early February 2019. Speech and Public Speaking Workshops will be held in February to assist the female high school students in turning their application essays into a speech to be presented at a final contest in front of a panel of judges. The 10 finalists will compete in a speech competition on Thursday, March 28 at 6:30 p.m. at JLD Headquarters. Scholarships will be awarded to winners of the speech competition. Community Grants Presentation

The Junior League of Dallas will hold its annual Community Grants Presentation at NorthPark Center the morning of Saturday, Feb. 16. Representatives from the 39 partner agencies, which were carefully chosen by the JLD Research and Development Committee, will be in attendance to receive grants for the 2019-2020 year.



The Community Grant Program represents \$770,000 in funding and 1,046 trained volunteer placements within these partner agencies. This year's Provisional class has been busy! They are excited to share that they recently completed the following Provisional Projects. The Trunk or Treat event at the Dallas Children's Advocacy Center brought joy to the children in attendance. Each group had a theme to their trunk and, of course, delicious drinks and sugary treats! The ladies also volunteered this fall at CitySquare hosting seasonal parties for the patrons. Provisionals volunteered at the Health Fair and Festival of Lights at the Heart House at Vickery Meadows. Since 1984, Promise House has been an open door to children, teens and families in crisis serving approximately 1,700 youth and families annually.
