About Our Scholarship Award Program

The Mid-Cities Alumnae Panhellenic Association annually awards a scholarship to outstanding applicant(s) who exhibit good values, achievements, scholarship, leadership and community service. To be eligible for the scholarship, the applicants must be enrolled in at least 12 semester hours. They must write a letter describing their personal achievements and goals, attach a copy of their college transcript and secure a letter of reference from their sorority advisor in addition to filling out the application. The scholarship recipient must have attended a public high school in one of the following school districts: Birdville, Grapevine-Colleyville, Hurst-Euless-Bedford, Irving, Keller, Northwest or Southlake Carroll. Additionally, sorority women from the Mid-Cities area who attended area private schools such as: Covenant Christian Academy, Fort Worth Christian, Fort Worth Country Day School, Hockaday, Nolan Catholic, The Oakridge School, Ursuline Academy are encouraged to apply.
